



## Fact Sheet:

### ***Purpose:***

National Sisterhood United for Journeymen Linemen (NSUJL), a non-profit organization, is dedicated to serving I.B.E.W. Linemen and/or their spouses and children. It's NSUJL's mission to provide emergency financial, emotional and physical assistance, in cases of work related injuries or death.

### ***Funding:***

The NSUJL Assistance is 100% dependant upon Public Support and Donations.

### ***Requirements:***

To qualify for NSUJL benefits, an applicant must have been killed or injured on the job, during working hours and must meet one of the following requirements:

- Be an IBEW Journeyman Lineman and/or the Spouse/Child there of.
- Be an IBEW Apprentice Lineman and/or the Spouse/Child there of.
- Be an otherwise classified IBEW Linemen and/or Spouse/Child there of.

### ***Disqualifications:***

After meeting the requirements, immediate disqualifications of Financial Assistance include:

- Deceased/Injured was intoxicated or under the influence of illegal drugs at the time of the accident.
- Deceased/Injured was not current on their monthly dues.
- Applicant is receiving Public Welfare.

### ***Financial Assistance:***

Financial Assistance applicants/recipients in case of death may obtain benefits for a maximum of six (6) months or until death/pension benefits provided by the IBEW are paid. These benefits will be paid in addition to any other income the household may be receiving to the combined maximum of the regular average monthly net wages of the deceased.

- Income is defined as any cash or in-kind contributions received by an applicant or recipient in the month of receipt and deducted from the grant amount.

Financial Assistance applicants/recipients in cases of injury may obtain benefits for a maximum of six (6) months. These benefits will subsidize in addition to any Disability benefits the person(s) is receiving to a combined maximum of the regular average monthly net wage received by applicant.

Disability payments are defined as:

- SSI/SSD, or
- Local Union provided disability benefits, or
- State Disability Insurance (SDI), or
- Worker's Compensation

***Other types of Assistance Include:***

**Professional Counseling:** NSUJL will help set the family up with professional counseling as deemed appropriate within the recipients' area. Deductibles will be paid by NSUJL for a Maximum of six (6) counseling sessions.

**Medical Bills:** Injured Recipients may qualify for Medical Bill assistance up to a Maximum of \$3000.00.

**Emotional Support:** Provided by our incredible group of volunteers who understand the devastation of an accident. These benefits include: Visiting with the family, providing home cooked meals, helping with household chores, running errands, etc. This is unlimited and has no limitations.

**Scholarships:** \$2,000 per person with a maximum of \$6,000 per family.
